STRATEGY OBJECTIVE

The objective of this strategy is to target an annual return of CPI plus 4%-5% over a rolling 36-month period and not to lose capital over a rolling 24-month period, while at all times remaining within Prudential guidelines.

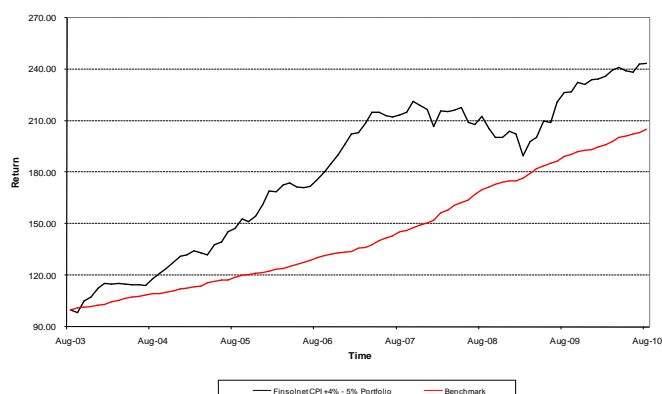

COMMENTARY

The portfolio underperformed its benchmark during the 3-month period, returning 1.83% against the benchmark return of 1.92%. The portfolio, however, continues to outperform its benchmark since inception.

Over the 3-month period to the end of August 2010, the FTSE/JSE All Share Index returned 0.88%, the All Bond Index returned 7.53%, cash returned 1.70% and the South African Property Index returned 10.95%. During the same period, international equities returned -3.73% and international fixed interest returned 3.15%. Local property was the best performing asset class followed by local bonds. The Rand appreciated by 3.81% against the US dollar over the period having a negative impact on the international equity exposure within the portfolio.

CPI ended the month at 3.70% and remained below the
